### The Scholarship Committee Concludes Another Successful Year



The Norwich Women's Club 2009 Scholarships were awarded to total of twenty local residents. Nine of these were 2009 high school graduates and eleven were less recent grads who currently live in town. The committee gave two Woodworth Awards, recognizing community service, and one Marion Cross Award, recognizing an interest in a career in teaching. The total amount of money presented this year was \$32,900. The awards ranged from \$500 to \$3,500, with approximately two-thirds of the funds going to the new grads.

The scholarship committee structure follows the mandate which requires scholarship committees, such as ours, to have a minority of members representing the organization and a majority representing the larger community. Thus the committee is composed of two NWC members and three community members, all serving for staggered three-year terms. For the 2010 awards, the committee is Sue Kaufman (NWC) as chair, Onita Connington (NWC), Uwe Bagnato, Dan Fraser and Carolyn Frye

The broader constituency of the committee has proven to be a real advantage to the process. The community members are highly interested and have contributed significantly to making good decisions about the awards. In addition, the NWC scholarship tradition is now more widely known in Norwich than ever before. Starting in 2009, VSAC changed the application due date to early March which requires that we begin the process of sending out letters to the community about our scholarships in early January. The committee makes its decisions in time for VSAC to notify scholarship recipients in mid-May.
