NEARLY NEW - NEWS

Going Digital -- Update

Eight NWC Board members have been exploring, helping create, and field-testing a digital pre-consignment program for the past many weeks with the assistance Andrea Granger, Richmond Middle School Technology Specialist, who designed the program based on our input.

There has been a lot of fine-tuning along the way, but we have all successfully pre-consigned, printed tags and tagged our 400 plus items. The tag shape is different from the ones we have been using, so when you see a tag looking much like those in retail stores, you'll know the item was digitally pre-consigned.

All those on the exploration team found digital pre-consigning to be convenient and easy. The program numbers the item and formats the tags which are printed on a perforated card stock which each consignor had to separate, match to the garments, and attach with a tagging gun.

The ultimate test will take place during the coming NNS window from inspection to closing, including the accounting piece. There will definitely be some follow-up tech meetings after the sale closes and the checks are mailed out (4-6 weeks after May 1) to work out any problems.

Though we won't be going public with the digital option for the fall sale, we have decided to increase the number of digital pre-consignors to 25 people for the fall sale, more than doubling the field test number.

On a personal note, though I can be easily frustrated by technology, I found

this experience to be really simple and pre-consigning much less time consuming.

Many thanks to the other field testers for their time and input as the Nearly New Sale moves forward into 21st century: Sue Kaufman, Debby Hall, Annette Brown, Carol Loveland, Debbie Carter, Lily Trajman, and Jaci Allen.
