Curried Chicken Balls, from Barbara Kenny

- 1 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened
- 4 TBS mayonnaise
- 2 cups chopped cooked chicken
- 1 ¼ cups almonds, finely chopped
- 3 TBS chopped chutney
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tsp. curry powder
- 1 cup grated coconut

Blend cream cheese and mayonnaise. Sauté almonds in 1 TBS butter until lightly browned, or you can brown in oven at 350 degrees for 10 minutes.

Add almonds, chicken, chutney, salt and curry powder to cream cheese mixture. Shape into walnut sized balls. Roll each ball in coconut. Chill until

"How did we do?" is the first question asked right after the sale closes. We did an impressive \$24,300 in gross sales. Definitely not a record breaker for a fall sale, but a decent sum to return 50% to consignors and the rest going to the Norwich Women's Club Scholarship Fund after expenses.

keener vision. Over the past years, many items passed inspection that shouldn't have and those items ended up in the reject box; typically two to three large full bins. When an item is discovered by a volunteer or shopper to be substandard, the tag is pulled and marked with an R on the front of the tag and a brief description of the reason on the back. Those tags are then sorted in number order and referred to in case a consignor has a question regarding an item not selling; also, the reasons for rejection are reviewed so we can improve the inspection process. I am so pleased to report that just eight items were found lacking this sale! Barely a quarter container full! Let the lights shine on!

Reducing the number of items to be pre-consigned and consigned by 20% definitely helped ease the overflowing rack problem; volunteers found hanging garments easier prior to the sale and many shoppers commented on how much easier it was to shop; also moving tall racks off to the sides of the space provided a clearer view of rack signage.

Future of Digital Pre-consignment

Still in the experimental stage, a small number of pre-consignors accepted an invitation to consign on line as part of our Beta test group. Though still a few kinks to work out, the digital team is working on problems and improvements to move the process forward to a larger group. Will keep you posted.
