Any member of the Norwich community is eligible who has made exceptional humanitarian, educational, civic, or cultural contributions to Norwich, the Upper Valley, or the world at large through community service.

Any resident of Norwich may nominate a candidate by describing why the person deserves this special recognition. Nominations may be made in two ways: 1. A nomination form is at www.norwichwomensclub.org and may be e-mailed or hard-copied to Cheryl Herrmann, POB 321, Norwich, VT 05055 or CHerrmann@Remaxgroupone.com. 2. Nominations are also accepted by simply sending several paragraphs to the same address describing the candidate's merits as a Citizen of the Year. Be sure to include contact information for the candidate you are nominating.

The winner will be honored at the Second Annual Spring Gala to be held on Friday evening, March 15, and will receive the \$500 Ledyard Grant for Community Service, to be used for the charity of the winner's choosing.
